11. Education: gymnasium in Hodmezovasarhely, in 1953. Entered medical school, but withdrew after three months. Later, he wanted to enter the Budapest School of Economics, but was not admitted.
12. Occupation: Before 1945, respondent was a child. In 1954, he worked one month as a clerk in transportation department of a local brick factory. Was dismissed for political reasons. Worked one month as a bank teller and six months as clerk for a dairy farm cooperative. In both places, he was dismissed for political reasons. In 1955, he worked for two months as a worker on the maintenance team for the Hungarian railroad. From here, he was drafted for military duty. After receiving his discharge from the army, he went home and worked on his father's farm. On Saturdays and Sundays, he played in a dance band.
13. Parents Living: Yes, and are 64 and 60, respectively (Father and mother). They are now in Hungary.
14. Brothers or Sisters? Two brothers, age 30 and 26 and three sisters, 24, 30 and 37. All are now in Hungary.
