Respondent is an economics student. His back-ground is both industrial worker and peasant. Fairly intelligent and we established a good rapport. He belonged to the smart young set called "JAMPEC" by the Communists. He took an active part in the revolution and was wounded twice. Fears retaliation against relatives still in Hungary. Gives the impression of being homesick and intends to go back to Hungary as soon as the present regime collapses.
