5. Protestant (Calvinist)
6. Born at Tiszacsenge, Hajdu County, in Hungary.
7. Respondent spent most of her life in Budapest, Hungary.
8. Just before the revolution broke out, she also lived in Budapest, in the Obuda District.
9. Respondent is a graduate of the commercial and vocational high school, and also spent one year at the university. She wanted to become a professor of mathematics, but interrupted her studies when she married.
10. Respondent worked for the number one state construction company at Budapest between 1951 and 1956.
11. Respondent's husband is 39 years of age, also a Calvinist. He was born at Vasarosnameny, County Berge, Hungary. He also lived in Budapest right before the revolution broke out. He is a member of the Hungarian Parliament, and of the political committee of the Smallholders' Party. He also was abroad several times in Germany, Switzerland, Denmark and France when taking part in agricultural conferences. He served his compulsory military service in 1938 and 1939 when he attained the rank of ensign. He is a high school graduate, also of the teachers college. He was teaching philosophy and pedagogy, but prior to this he was also working at the Teleki Pal Scientific Institute. He taught at the Ferry Oscar Teachers College by the Hungarian Arrow Cross Party. Then after his release from January 1945 he was a member of the Parliament representing the Smallholders Party; he also was the National Manager of the Hungarian Peasants' Union. He was taken by the Communists in 1947 and sentenced to 3 years in prison. After his release in 1950 he worked as a navy, and later on as an electrician until the day of the revolution.

12. Respondent's parents are living in Budapest, Hungary. Father is 59, mother 57 years of age.
13. Respondent has one brother and two sisters. The brother is 34 years old and at present imprisoned by the Communists. The two sisters are 35 and 37 respectively, and work in Budapest.
14. Respondent has two children, 10 and 7. Both are girls and are with her in the United States, in N.Y.C. RMX
15. Respondent left Hungary on November 20, 1956.
16. Respondent arrived in the U.S. on December 13, 1956.
17. Has been first at Camp Kilmer, then in New York City, New Jersey, and also in Buffalo and Dayton, Ohio. They have now come back and settled in N.Y.
18. Respondent's immediate plans refer more to her husband's activities because she is staying at home, keeping house for her husband and children. Her husband is taking an active part in the newly formed Hungarian Association of Freedom Fighters and Refugees.
19. Respondent has been interviewed only at the American Legation in Vienna before her immigration.
20. She speaks German and now is learning English.
