6. Born in Budapest, Hungary
7. Spent most of her life in Budapest, Hungary
8. Lived just before the Revolution broke out in the 7th and 10th districts of Budapest. The 7th district is a typical working class district, and the 10th is in the outskirts of Budapest, where also the working class has a little suburb with houses.
9. Respondent had an 8th grade schooling.
10. Respondent worked from June, 1950 to June, 1954, at the State taxicab enterprises' office. In between for half a year she worked as a mechanic in the spare parts factory of the same enterprise.

From September, 1954 to November, 1955, she was a bus conductor with the municipal bus company; and from December, 1955 to 1956 until the outbreak of the Revolution she worked for the state machinery shop where she was a mechanic and maintenance woman for heavy machinery.

11. Both of respondent's parents are living, father is 47 and mother is 45, and they live now in Hungary, in Budapest, in the 18th district, called Petaszentlerina. Respondent has one sister who is 20 years old; she also lives with the parents in the same place.

12. Respondent left Hungary Nov. 22, 1956, and arrived in the United States on Dec. 8, 1956. She has been so far only in Camp Kilmer, New Jersey, and in New York City.

13. At present, she makes her living by working in the ^{on learning English, we} technical office of Horn and Hardaway, New York, but she is very keen and wants to attend night school and specialize in mechanical draftsmanship. She also would like to graduate from High School.

14. Respondent has not been interviewed by any organizations since she left Hungary, except in Salzburg, by the American Consulate General in connection with emigration. The respondent does not speak any foreign languages.
