I. PERSONAL INVENTORY

1. Respondent's Code Number is 71-1
2. Age is 29
3. Male
4. Divorced
5. Protestant
6. Born in small village of ~~XXXX~~ Sala.
7. Spent most of his life in Budapest
8. Before the Revolution he lived in Komlo.
9. Respondent was abroad in Poland for six months in 1943 in service

and in 1942 for three months, in Italy, training as a pilot in the Hungarian Air Force. He served in the Hungarian military services from 1940 to 1945, all of this in the Air Force. Part of this time he was in the vocational school of the Air Force, from 1940 to 1942. He became a lieutenant.

In 1951 respondent was made a private in the reserve of the Hungarian People's Army, and assigned to the Signal Corps, for 6-1/2 months re-training. The retraining emphasis was political re-education.

10. Respondent's education consists of: vocational high school of the Hungarian Air Force (emergency graduate, 1942) - from 1940 to 1952 he attended an Adult Education class, at night, in general machine industry.

11. Respondent's occupations were as follows: From 1945 to 1947, radio mechanic in a radio repair shop; in 1947, this shop was nationalized and became part of a ~~xxxx~~ larger state enterprise. He kept working in the same capacity as before, until 1949. From that year until 1952, respondent he worked in ~~xxxx~~ Ganz, in a ~~xxx~~ high voltage equipment manufacturing state enterprise, as a mechanic, and from 1952 to 1955 in that same enterprise as a technician. In 1954 he was sentenced to collective labor in coal mines, first as a miner until the revolution ~~xxxxx~~ broke out, ~~xxxxxxx~~

12. Both of the respondent's parents are living. Father is 76, and mother, 74. They live in Budapest.

13. Respondent has three married sisters, one is 42, another 41, and the ~~thirty~~ third, 39. All live in Budapest. He also has one brother, 32 years old, who is in Canada.

14. Respondent has ^{daughters,} two/xxxx aged 5-1/2 and 8.
15. These children lived with his mother, but they were taken away and respondent does not know where they are now. The Communist authorities were the ones who took them away, from his mother.
16. Respondent left Hungary on November 28, 1956.
17. He arrived in the United States on Dec. 5, 1956.
18. Respondent has been in New York since he came to the United States, ~~xxxxxxx~~ except for a brief time when he visited Washington, D.C., in Cleveland and Columbus, both in Ohio.
19. Respondent's immediate plans are to work as a tool maker, if he can find such a job, to be back in his own field as a mechanic, and a technician, if he can receive a scholarship so he can study for it (the latter ?) at a school.
20. Respondent was interviewed by the C.I.C. in Vienna, the interview lasting for 3 days. In the United States, he was again interviewed, this one lasting one day.
