Respondent spent most of her life in Hungary in Budapest

Respondent lived just before the revolution broke out in Budapest in the Seventh District.

Respondent never was abroad.

Respondent's education was 4 yrs. elementary school and 4 grades secondary school.

Occupation is seamstress - dressmaker.

After finishing her school, respondent ~~skilled~~ became an apprentice, and after having received her license, she worked at different dress-making establishments - mostly privately owned.

Between 1952 and '53, she was employed at a state plant of wholesale dress manufacturing. industry

From 1953 - '56, she was employed by the handi-craft enterprise, which was a state owned enterprise also, and manufactured wholesale dresses and embroideries. Sometimes she worked in the office of the same company.

Her parents are living in Budapest. The father is 59; the mother is 55. Respondent has no brothers or sisters.

Respondent left Hungary November 26, 1956 and arrived in the US Jan. 30, 1957. She stayed at Camp Kilmer and then in New York City. Her immediate plans are to train in machine bookkeeping and also to learn English. As a dressmaker she doesn't see any great possibilities. Respondent was not interviewed by any Western organizations since leaving Hungary. She underwent only the routine interview at the American Consulate in Vienna. Respondent does not speak any foreign language. She understands German.

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
