 10. She received preparatory training as an employee of the Ministry of the Interior as her capacity as a nurse of a prison. She received two months regular training, and afterwards she had three hours of training every week. Her highest rank was that ¹of a sergeant.
 11. She completed ¹eight grades of school; one-half year of theoretical nurse training, and one and a half years of practical nurse training; later, one year of surgical nurse training.
 12. Speaking of her occupation, she was a nurse from 1935-1942; from 1942 to 1944, she was a housewife. From 1944, she was a volunteer Red Cross nurse. From 1945 - 1950 she was a housewife. From 1950, she was nurse again in a hospital, and from 1956 until the revolution, she was a nurse in the prison hospital.
 13. Her ¹first husband, to whom she was married from 1938 - 1950 was an auto-technician.
- Her second husband, to whom she was married from 1953 until Oct. 1956, was a furrier. Her parents are living; her father is 77 and her mother is 65; they are in Hungary.
- She has six brothers and sisters, and she proudly mentions that none of them is a Communist nor is ¹an Communist affiliated organization. Her brothers are 48, 46, 54, and 32, and her sisters are 36 and 37.

Respondent has no children.

She left Hungary on Nov. 22, 1956

She arrived in the United States, Dec. 24, '56. She spent most of her time in New York in the USA, and she also spent three months in Forest Park, Penna. where she was a nurse in a camp of the International Garment Workers Union.

Her immediate plans are to get back to her trained field, mainly to become a surgical nurse again.
