At the outbreak of the revolution respondent resided in the lith district of Budapest at 36 Uzscha-Road.

Respondent spent fourteen months in France, and three months in Belgium as prisoner of war after World War II.

Served three years in bungarian army during the war, top rank was adresent.

Respondent's education is the equivilant of eight grades of grammar school. He also completed training courses in nursing, and is a qualified surgical assistant.

Before the war in 1942 and 443 respondent worked as an apprentice nurse in the Emergency Hospital (Baleseti Korhaz) in Budspest. He was then drafted for military service, and returned in 1946. From 1946 until 1951 he worked as a surgical assistant in the Municipal Hospital on Useoki Road. From 1951 to 153 he worked in the same capacity at the post-graduate school for surgeons in Budapest. From 1954 on he was a

Surgical assistant in the hospital of the Hungarian National Blood Bank in Budapest.

Respondent's parents have both died.
