45 yrs. old.

He was born in Szeged.

He lived in Budapest just before the Revolution broke out.

He was more than once abroad: between 1932 and 1937, he spent most of his summer vacations on various trips in Italy, in Germany, in France and in England; besides, he also spent two and a half semesters at the medical department of one of the Austrian Universities.

Respondent served in the Hungarian military service; his highest ranks were that of a major in the medical corps as a physician, and that of an Admiral's captain in the Hungarian airforce. He spent his regular duty between '31-'32, and he became an officer's sergeant candidate. Between '33-'37, he was called in for duty on eleven occasions, and in 1937 he became a lieutenant in the Reserve. It was then that he became a physician and served as such in the medical corps, but in 1937, he returned to civilian life again, and he spent all his ...brief periods during these years. He was called in again in 1943, and until 1945, he served as an Army sergeant in an Army hospital, and then became a major.

Speaking of his education, between '30-'31, he studied one and a half architecture of semesters in engineering.

He completed medical school in the years '32-'38 and he specialised in bio-chemistry.

Between '38-'40, he worked as a physician at the Keckemet Hospital. Between '40 and '41, he worked at the city hospital of Kaposvar as an physician. Between '41,

and '45, with the interruptions of duty in the Army, he was a surgeon at the surgical department of the Oti Hospital. After '45, he worked both at surgical departments and in a maternity ward and became an obstetrician. In '48, he became a physician of the Budapest subway construction State enterprise. In '52, he became head physician of the diagnosis department of the Goldberger Plant. Since '50, he also worked part-time as a physician of the ambulance service. In '52, he became (working part time) a surgeon of the Hospital National Ambulance Service. After Nov. 4th, he became a director of a new remodeled hospital of this National Ambulance Service.

Both of his parents are dead.

Respondent had a brother and he is also dead.

Respondent has one girl - she is now 17yrs old - and lives in Budapest with respondent's brother-in-law and sister.

Respondent left Hungary on Nov. the 29th.

He arrived in the United States in March 16th.

He spent one month in Washington, D.C. - a few weeks in Peekskill, N.Y., and most of the summer in a Pennsylvania Camp of the International Ladies Garment Worker's Union where he was a physician - the top physician.

His immediate plans concern internship and a chance to get his doctorate acknowledged in the U.S.A. as soon as possible.

Respondent was interviewed by American Intelligence in Camp Kilmer, and that interview lasted ~~xxxxxxx~~ four hours each on three occasions.

Respondent speaks very good German, and also writes it well.
