

for Lajos Marshallko, a writer, who was ordered deported by the United States Immigration Service for allegedly inciting mobs against captured American fliers during the war. Editorial writer of the paper, Oscar Robert, a converted Jew, is very unpopular in many Hungarian American circles.

Magyar Hírvéslap, 239 Fourth Avenue, Pittsburgh 22, Pennsylvania. Circulation: 1,448. Founded by a veteran Hungarian journalist, Martin Nissler, and now edited by his nephew, Andor Fay Fisher. Follows all important public events with critical interest and often opposes the policies of the American Hungarian Federation and the Hungarian National Council.

Magyar Hírök, 400 North Second Avenue, New Brunswick, New Jersey. Circulation: 5,300. Carries propaganda articles for the Budapest Government by Imre Bekesi, who left the United States two years ago and lives in Hungary now. Critical of the American Hungarian Federation and the Hungarian National Council.

Magyarok, 103 Hazelwood Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Circulation: 848. Small but influential organ of Western Pennsylvania parishes of the Reformed Church, criticizes the Hungarian National Council whose members "have collaborated with the Reds for two years." Demands participation in the Council of members who have been excluded as "Nazi."

Varosi Elet, 808 Western Avenue, South Bend 19, Indiana. Circulation 1,840. Liberal.

Periodicals:

Hronika, 307 Fifth Avenue, New York 18. Circulation: 6,000. Monarchist, pro-Habsburg. Monthly.

Magyar Egyház, 895 Home Street, New York 58. Monthly Organ of the Free Hungarian Reformed Church. Blamed the Hungarian National Council for emphasizing tolerance toward religious creeds, thus, "needlessly bringing this question to the surface.... Before the National Council was formed, there was good understanding in the Hungarian American community...."

Reformatusok Lapja, monthly, 55 North West Avenue, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Circulation: 2,000. Official organ of the Hungarian Synod of Reformed Churches. Conservative.

There are about twenty-five other periodicals in the Hungarian language. Most of them have little or no political significance.
