NEW YORK, (AP) - THE FIRST PLANELOAD OF EUROPEAN REFUGEES OF 1960 TO THE U.S. ARRIVED HERE BY AIR THURSDAY FROM MUNICH, A WESTERN NEWS AGENCY REPORTS.

THERE WERE 76 ON BOARD. THE REFUGEES, FROM 18 EASTERN EUROPEAN COUNTRIES, HAD FOUND ASYLUM IN AUSTRIA AND OTHER COUNTRIES WHILE COMPLETING ARRANGEMENTS TO COME TO THE UNITED STATES.

THE OCCUPATIONS OF THE ARRIVALS RANGED FROM PHYSICIAN TO JOCKEY. THE JOCKEY IS ISHTVAN KARASZK, 34, ACCOMPANIED BY HIS WIFE ROZSA AND THEIR DAUGHTER, KRISZTINGA, 10. KARASZK WAS A JOCKEY IN HUNGARY FOR 20 YEARS AND CONTINUED THAT OCCUPATION AFTER HE FOUND REFUGE IN VIENNA IN 1936. HE IS BEING RESETTLED WITH THE AID OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES.

THE REFUGEES ARRIVED ON A PLANE CHARTERED BY THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL COMMITTEE FOR EUROPEAN MIGRATION. A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ORGANIZATION SAID THAT 102,788 REFUGEES HAD BEEN RESETTLED BY THE ORGANIZATION IN 1959, OF WHOM 13,775 WERE SETTLED IN THE UNITED STATES.
